THE SILENCE OF THE "SENSE-US" – TRACKING MEMORIALS
ERECTED AFTER GUN VIOLENT HOMICIDES IN MILWAUKEE
10:15 – 11:15 a.m., Gathering Space - Lower Church

Catholic social teaching speaks against the culture of death resulting from gun violent homicides. It demands that the people of God engage in serious conversations about the memorials or death shrines that are erected after gun violent homicides in Milwaukee. Too many are unaware that these makeshift shrines are created in numerous public places as sacred spaces to remember those who have died tragically. Arguably, if this same number of shrines were created in suburban, more affluent communities as a result of gun violent homicides, the conversations about this phenomena would be vast and wide, even to the point of pushing for legislative solutions to the epidemic of gun violent homicides. The "silence of the sense-us" around gun violent homicides in Milwaukee, a particular census track area, along with the erection of memorials, are manifestations of covert racism verses overt racism.
